Attendance Policy

All students studying in the flute studio must also enroll in Music 294 or 494 (studio performance woodwinds.) This is a 0 credit course, but allows me to give you a grade for studio class attendance and/or performance. Studio Class will be held on Mondays at 4:40 PM, in Frasier 169. Attendance at ALL studio class sessions is required of anyone studying at the 274, 474, or 674 levels, regardless of major or degree program. Dates for studio classes will be announced at the beginning of the semester. If a scheduled studio class is ever cancelled, I will notify you via email or telephone as early as possible. If you must miss a studio class session for any reason, you must notify me in advance, and it will be at my discretion to excuse the absence. Electronic devices, such as cell phones or laptop computers, must be turned off and put away when you are in studio class. Excessive instances of phones ringing or text messaging during studio class may result in failure of the course.

Preparation Expectations

Each student must perform in studio class as referenced below. You must be completely prepared for your performances. Students performing in studio class will be expected to be prepared not only to play, but to talk about the pieces/etudes/excerpts being performed. If a student shows up unprepared for a studio class performance, it will not be counted toward the minimum performance requirement. If you are performing in studio class, you must be dressed appropriately for performance. This means that you should choose attire that you would wear for a concert, not every day casual clothing.

Minimum performance requirements:

Music Education Majors: 1 performance per semester

BM, MM, DA Students: 2 performances per semester

Students preparing a degree recital must perform as many times as needed, as arranged on an individual basis.
